
Rodriguez holds a bachelor's degree in psychology and human development from California State University at San Bernardino. In her spare time, she enjoys music, art, and traveling.

Rodriguez's mother marched with Cesar Chavez of the United Farm Workers. "Speaking up for people is in my blood," she said.



An Inventor in Our Ranks

Local 495 Member Innovates Improvement for Safety, Efficiency

Ezequiel Carrillo has been installing axles on big trucEzequiel Carrillo has been installing axles on big trucks for a long time. It's part of his job as a mechanic at Penske in Fontana. The axles are heavy – about 90 to 95 pounds each – and Ezequiel has seen too many people get hurt in the process of installing them.

"We have tools to remove them, but nothing to install them," he said. This leaves mechanics placing their fingers in a tight spot between pieces of heavy machinery.

So Carrillo took matters into his own hands and created the EZ Axle Installer (Patent Pending), a heavy-duty installer for large trucks. "The tool lets you guide and maneuver the axle so you can get it in without touching—or hurting—your fingers," explained Carrillo.



EZ AXLE will prevent common shop claims, such as broken fingers, back injuries, lacerations etc.

Carrillo developed the EZ Axle Installer, which improves both safety and efficiency, in his garage at home. It's something mechanics have needed for decades, and Carrillo figured it out in about a year and a half of trial and error

in his spare time. He built the

first one by hand and now has made about 20 with the help of a manufacturer.

This is not Carrillo's first invention. He previously devised a tool to help a friend who had hurt his back put on his socks without bending. He has also created a tool for saving water. "One year I saved enough fresh water to fill up a whole pool," the inventive mechanic reports.

"It's ingenious for someone to create a tool to improve their working life," said Business Agent Jim Lennox. "We're proud to have Ezequiel as part of our membership."

Thousands of Teamsters in the Food Industry Celebrate a New Contract

Members across Southern California stand secure in a new agreement

In October, members of Teamster Locals 495, 630, 63, and 848 ratified a new foodindustry contract that gives them job security now and expands their protections for the future. Thousands of union members at "Big 3" grocery companies Ralphs, Vons, and Albertson's are covered by the multi-year contract.

Under the new agreement, members will see wage and pension increases, and their health and welfare benefits are preserved.

The new contract also allows members at Ralphs to

divert wage increases into their pensions. Members at Vons already had this option, but it is a new benefit for Ralphs members – and one that can make a significant difference in their future.

"This will be a big help in members' ability

to protect themselves down the road," said President George Park.

Thousands of union members play crucial roles in bringing food to kitchens and dining tables all over our region. Among them, Local 495 represents about 100 fleet and maintenance mechanics at Ralphs, Vons, US Foods, and Unified Grocers. Some of these members are covered by the master contract that includes about 7,000 warehouse personnel, drivers, and others represented by multiple Teamster local unions.

Members at Unified, a coop, are covered under a distinct contract that was negotiated and ratified at the same time as the "Big 3" master contract.

"We were part of a concerted, multi-union effort to ensure that these union members will have job security, wages, and benefits commensurate with their hard work for years to come," said Park.

Sysco Members Unanimously Ratify New Contract

The six-year agreement includes wage increases and fully paid medical benefits

A new contract gives members at Sysco annual wage increases, fully employer-paid medical benefits, and job security for six years. "It's the best contract our members at Sysco Los Angeles have ever had," said President George Park, who served as the key negotiator.

"Having medical fully paid for six years is a big deal," said Business Agent Art Carrillo. In a climate where far too many Americans pay excessive amounts out of their own pockets for health care – if they can afford health insurance at all – union members know a good thing when they see it. Local 495 members at Sysco ratified the new agreement unanimously.

For shop steward Javier Maisterra, a journeyman mechanic, the highlight of the contract is the job security. "At six years, it is a good, long contract," he said.

Sysco offers food-service products to hundreds of thousands of customers around the world. About 20 members of Local 495 make sure their trucks are in good working order to transport important food-related products that pass through the company's Los Angeles location.



Union negotiates raises every year of new five-year agreement

With more than 150 locations across the United States, TCI Tire Centers meet the needs of both commercial-truck and passenger/light-truck customers. Here in Southern California, 32 Local 495 members at the Fontana location overwhelmingly ratified an exceptional new contract in October.

The agreement includes wage

increases every year of the fiveyear contract term.

Shop steward Jose Tristan is happy with the contract. "The best thing about it is the raise," he said. But that's not all. "There's paid vacation – and the health

insurance is perfect."


